The main objective of the organization is to support and promote Polish-Canadian business development within the community, to create and maintain a strong Polish-Canadian business lobby and to support educational, charitable and cultural activities of the Polish-Canadian community.

Business Activities

After 1995, the first Polish-Canadian Society Business Dinners have been held every year, except for 2009. Each event has a high-profile keynote speaker, special guest speakers, business and professional people and community representatives. The PCBPAW supports and promotes various initiatives, for example, the official opening of the European Market in Windsor (1999) and the national petition in support of the waiving of visa requirements for Poland (2008). The PCBPAW was invited by the House of Commons Standing Committee on International Trade to present a profile of the association and a summary of its activities (2017). Another example of our business activities is initiating and maintaining the Windsor-Lublin partnership during the last twenty years. Several business trips between our twin cities were organized in the past; the last one was the Windsor-Essex Development Mission to Poland (2019).

Windsor-Lublin Partnership

Windsor- Lublin business relations began in 1994, when Joe Ouellette, the owner of the Windsor firm Acrolab Ltd., established his company branch office in Lublin. The PCBPAW spearheaded and kept active international relations between Windsor and Lublin, Poland, since the signing of the official agreement in Windsor, on June 26, 2000. For example: benefits from this relationship include the gift from Lublin to Windsor of the Goat Fountain brass sculpture in 2008 to commemorate the 100th Anniversary of the Polish community in Windsor and the creation of the display on Pope John Paul II through cooperation between the Catholic University of Lublin and the PCBPAW. Several official visits were held by both cities and various reports were published. For example, the Rt. Hon. Herb Gray, former Deputy Prime Minister of Canada, received the title *Dr. Honoris Causa* at the Catholic University of Lublin (2003) and Joe Comartin, MP, Windsor-Tecumseh, Ontario, and later Deputy Speaker of the House of Commons, visited Lublin (2006). During the 10th (2010) and 15th (2015) Anniversaries of the Windsor-Lublin partnership, the Mayor of Windsor, Drew Dilkens, led delegations to Lublin.

Culture

Since 2007, the PCBPAW has been involved in obtaining and/or creating nine national displays. Six of them were created with a major partner, the Leddy Library of the University of Windsor. In 2017, the collection was completed to form the Canada 150 Exhibition. It consists of three thematic groups. The first group presents Canadians of Polish heritage, namely: Sir Casimir Stanislaus Gzowski, one of the noblest and the most successful engineers on this continent; Alexandre-Edouard Kierzkowski, the first Polish-Canadian Member of the House of Commons in the first Parliament of Canada; and Members of the Canadian Parliament of Polish heritage. The second one is about reasons for Polish gratitude to Canada: the Odyssey of Wawel's Treasures, held in safekeeping by Canada from 1940 to 1961; the Polish Army Training Camp "Kościuszko" at Niagara-on-the-Lake, Ontario, Canada, during WWI; and the Polish Army Recruiting Station in Windsor, Ontario, Canada, during WWII. The third group presents Poles with worldwide fame: Pope John Paul II- Poland's Gift to the World; Maria Skłodowska-Curie- the Greatest Female Scientist of All Time; and Fryderyk Chopin- brilliant Polish composer and prince of the romantic pianists. During Canada's 150th Anniversary celebration in 2017, the collection and selected displays were presented in various cities and places in Canada, including the Federal and Province of Ontario Parliaments. For example, the official opening was on April 23, 2017, at the Leddy Library, University of Windsor, then a major presentation of the collection was at the Ontario Parliament in Toronto on May 29, 2017. In 2017, the Polish Post Office issued a special edition of Polish stamps with pictures of Sir C.S. Gzowski and A.-É. Kierzkowski. The Canada 150 Exhibition also was shown in 2018 to mark the one-hundredth anniversary of Poland regaining independence at the close of the First World War. Major Jerzy Radwanek, political prisoner in the Nazi German concentration camp, KL Auschwitz (1940-1944), is the subject of

The PCBPAW was asked to initiate and then be involved in the organization of five Polish Weeks in Windsor, namely in 2002, 2004, 2006, 2008 and 2013. All of them included various events promoting the history and heritage of the Polish Community in Windsor. In 2008, during Polish Week in Windsor, the Polish Community celebrated the 100th Anniversary of settlement in Windsor. The book and video, "One Century of the Polish Community in Windsor, 1908-2008", were published. Also, in 2008, a special gift from Lublin to the citizens of Windsor, a brass Goat Fountain, was installed in the Riverside Park, along the Detroit River.

Support of Young Leaders of Polonia

The Association from its beginning has supported and sponsored the activities of young Polonia, for example, the Polish-Canadian Quo Vadis Conferences for young leaders (since 2009), Annual Polish- Canadian Society Business Dinners, Polish Weeks in Windsor, and young leaders' events at Queen's Park, Toronto, and the Federal Parliament in Ottawa. Also, the PCBPAW supports activities of the Polish Canadian Students' Association in Windsor (PCSAW) and the Polish Students' Initiative in Canada (PISK), an organization coordinating student groups across Canada.



2.1 Polish-Canadian Society Annual Business Dinners (1995-2019)

The activities of the PCBPAW began on October 14, 1995, when the first Polish-Canadian Society Business Dinner was held at the Dom Polski Hall, 1275 Langlois Avenue, in Windsor, Ontario. Since then, every year (except in 2009), Annual Polish-Canadian Society Business Dinners are held. Each event has a high-profile keynote speaker, special guest speakers, business and professional people and community representatives. The PCBPAW supports and promotes various initiatives, for example, the official opening of the European Market in Windsor (1999) and the national petition in support of the waiving of visa requirements for Poland (2008). The PCBPAW was invited by the House of Commons Standing Committee on International Trade to present a profile of the association and a summary of its activities (2017). Another example of our business activities is initiating and maintaining the Windsor-Lublin partnership during the last twenty years. Several business trips between our twin cities were organized in the past; the last one was the Windsor-Essex Development Mission to Poland (2019).





Polish ambassador pitches capitalism for his country

Poland is open for business and looking for investors from Windsor. Prof. Bogdan Grzelonski, the Polish

Ambassador to Canada, was in the city Saturday at the invita-tion of the Polish-Canadian Business and Professional Association of Windsor. As guest speaker at the group's annual Business Dinner, Prof. Bogdar Grzelonski wasted no Grzelons time getting down to trying to lure investment from busin the city's strong Polish community.

"Poland is open for foreign capital," Grzelonski told the crowd of about 200. "There is a lot of (opportunity) in the country for people with bright ideas." Poland, a country of 40 million con-sumers, is becoming one of the success stories of Eastern Europe.

Privatized

After pulling itself from the morass of Communist rule in 1989, the fielding democracy began privatizing with aban-don — once untouchable state monopolies like shipbuilding, manufacturing, telecommunications and the transportation system are, or are soon to be, open to tender. Foreigners pumped \$21 billion into the Polish economy in 1997. While inflation is relatively high in

was running at more than 500 per cent only a few years ago. "We would like to (emulate) the West, in-cluding Canada, in terms of economic de-velopment," Grzelonski said. Windsor-Lublin business relations began in 1994, when Joe Ouellette, the owner of the Windsor firm Acrolab Ltd., established his business branch lab in Lublin, Poland. In 1999, the Polish-Canadian Business and Professional Association of Windsor prepared and circulated a petition requesting twinning of the City of Windsor and Lublin, Poland. The petition was signed by twelve representatives of the Polish Community in Windsor and sent to the City of Windsor, where approval was granted. Then, the City of Windsor sent a request to the City of Lublin and approval was granted at the beginning of 2000. Following the twinning process, the City of Windsor invited the Major of Lublin to visit Windsor in June 2000 to sign the agreement and to be part of the millennium celebration with Windsor's other twin cities.





On July 15, 2019, on the one-hundredth anniversary of his birthday, in the Hieronim Łopaciński Voivodeship Library in Lublin, an exhibition about the late Jerzy Radwanek was shown, the third one this year. The first vernissage took place in Montréal, Canada, and the next was held at the Royal Baths Park in Warszawa. The purpose of the display was to present the life of Jerzy Radwanek, an exceptional man and pride of the School of Eaglets ("Szkoła Orląt") in Dęblin, Lublin Voivodeship, in which he was a graduate at its thirteenth promotion, in September 1939. However, for him flying planes was not to be, for he entered history as a hero, number 7782 in the German Nazi concentration camp KL Auschwitz. He was awarded the Medal of Righteous Among the Nations for saving the lives of Jews in a camp, where for nearly five years he had to fight for his own life.



4. CULTURE

4.1 Canada 150 Polish-Canadian Heritage Exhibition- Visual Concept

Since 2007, the PCBPAW was involved in obtaining and/or creating nine national displays. Six of them were created with a major partner, the Leddy Library of the University of Windsor. In 2017, the collection was completed to form the Canada 150 Exhibition. It consists of three thematic groups. The first group presents Canadians of Polish heritage, namely: Sir Casimir Stanislaus Gzowski, one of the noblest and the most successful engineers on this continent; Alexandre-Édouard Kierzkowski, the first Polish-Canadian Member of the House of Commons in the first Parliament of Canada; and Members of the Canadian Parliament of Polish heritage. The second one is about reasons for Polish gratitude to Canada: the Odyssey of Wawel's Treasures, held in safekeeping by Canada from 1940 to 1961; the Polish Army Training Camp "Kosciuszko" at Niagara-on-the-Lake, Ontario, Canada, during WWI; and the Polish Army Recruiting Station in Windsor, Ontario, Canada, during WWI. The third group presents Poles with worldwide fame: Pope John Paul II- Poland's Gift to the World; Maria Skłodowska -Curie- the Greatest Female Scientist of All Time; and Fryderyk Chopin - brilliant Polish composer and prince of the rowantic planists. During Canada's 150th Anniversary celebration in 2017, the complete collection and selected displays were presented at various locations in Canada, including the Federal Parliament and the Province of Ontario Parliament. The official opening was on April 23, 2017, at the Leddy Library, University of Windsor. On May 29, 2017, there was a major presentation of the collection at the Ontario Parliament in Toronto, . In 2017, the Polish Post Office issued a special edition of stamps with pictures of Sir C.S. Gzowski and A.-É. Kierzkowski.



4.5 Polish Weeks in Windsor

The PCBPAW was asked by Jacek Junosza-Kisielewski, Consul General of Poland in Toronto, to initiate and then be involved in the organization of Polish Weeks in Windsor, namely in 2002, 2004, 2006, 2008 and 2013. All of them included various events promoting the history and heritage of the Polish Community in Windsor. In 2008, during Polish Week in Windsor, the Polish Community celebrated the 100th Anniversary of settlement in Windsor. The book and video, "One Century of the Polish Community in Windsor, 1908-2008", were published. Also, in 2008, a special gift from Lublin to the citizens of Windsor, a brass Goat Fountain, was installed at the Riverside Park, along the Detroit River.



A DAY ON THE HILL - "LEADERS IN ACTION"

By <u>Monika Wyczykowska</u> Gothic gargoyles, crimison carpets, and masonny fit for a monarch—these are just a few of the sights young leaders of the Polish-Canadian community took in as they visited Parliament Hill in Ottawa in March for a "Leaders in Action" summit coorganized by the Young Polish-Canadian Professionals Association (YCCPA) and the Polish Students Initiative of Canada (PISK). Coming in on the heels of the first summit in September 2012, the day was meant to introduce us to the inner workings of the Canadian political system and to also meet and greet with some of its main actors.



And our day truly was jam-packed with action. After being ushered in through



security, we started off the morning with round-table discussions with members of Her Majesty's Loyal Opposition. Peggy Nash, MP for Parkdale—High Park and the NDP's Finance Critic, is a familiar figure in the Polish-Canadian community; after all, her riding is home to Roncesvalles Ave. and its many Polish institutions. Ms. Nash discussed her vision for a fair and balanced economy since, in Ms. Nash's words, "the role of the Opposition is to also be propositional."

From the economy we moved on to the environment with the NDP's

Deputy Leader and Environment Critic Megan Leslie, MP for Halifax. Ms. Leslie's passion for the subject was infectious and sparked a discussion about natural resources and

the price of pollution. We also discovered a Polish connection-Ms. Leslie's half-brother and -sister are both Polish!

We continued to ask questions of our outstanding tour guide who showed us around Centre Block. One of thighlights was the Library of Parliament, watched over by the keen eve of a mathle Queen Victoria statue dating from 1871.

Shortly thereafter, we sat down to a very welcome luncheon hosted by Joe Comartin, MP for Windsor-Tecumseh and Deputy Speaker of the House of Commons. Many thanks must be given to Mr. Comartin, who was instrumental in putting this visit together in collaboration with our ever-present mentor, Jerzy Barycki of Windsor. The luncheon featured MPs of varying experience in the House: as Mr. Comartin put It, we had the 'rookie' MP Wildyslaw Lizon, 'the intermediate' MP Peggy Nash, and 'the elder' MP John MacKay. MP Ted Opitz also joined us

for lunch. We heard many inspiring stories, from Mr. Lizon's role in the Polish-Canadian community, to Ms. Nash's



Polish Diaspora celebrates community in Canada

100th anniversary of Windsor Polonia, Nov. 8-15

When the Polish-Canadian Congress sent a delegation to Ottawa to meet with the Prime Minister and celebrate three important milestones of the Polish community in Canada, the Town of LaSalle's development engineer, Jerry Barycki, was there.

Barycki, who immigrated to Canada from his native Poland in 1982, even had the honour of presenting Prime Minister Stephen Harper with the Centennial Gold Medal of the Polonia of Windsor-the commemoration of 100 years of the Polish community in Windsor being just one of the three cultural milestones.

Altogether, 24 people from Windsor and nearly 600 from across Canada were in Ottawa to mark the 150th anniversary of the first organized Polish settlement by the Kaszubs in Barry's Bay, Ont., and the 75th anniversary of the Canadian Polish Congress.

Barycki, who serves as vice-president of Polish affairs for the Canadian-Polish Congress and president of the Polish Canadian Business and Professional Association of Windsor, had the honour of presenting Harper with the Centennial Gold Medal.

"They told me I was not allowed to put the medal on the Prime Minister," Barycki said, recounting the protocol

instructions given to him by Prime Minister's Office staffers. "Then, when I presented the medal

to him, he said 'Can I put it on?' and I said 'Of course!'" Barycki laughed.

Ottawa gala

The presentation was made before a gala in a West Block ballroom on Parliament Hill, June 10. The evening was attended by other dignitaries aside from the Prime Minister, including MP Blaine Calkins, chair of the Canada-Poland Parliamentary Friendship Group; H.E. Piotr Ogrodzinski, Ambassador of Poland; and Wladyskaw Lizon, president of the Canadian Polish Congress.

"These anniversaries remind us how much Polish Canadians-more than 800,000 strong today-have done to build out great country, Harper said in a statement. "Polish Canadians have made their mark in every walk of Canadian life."

The Prime Minister noted that the government and the Canadian Polish Congress have worked together on numerous initiatives to strengthen ties between Canada and Poland, including the removal of visa requirements for Polish visitors to Canada, a Social Security agreement allowing the portability of pensions from either country, and a Youth Mobility agreement which allows youth to work and study up to one year in the two countries.

It wasn't until the Solidarity movement in the late 1980s that Poland finally gained autonomy. The country has been free from 1989 through the present day.

A \$45,000 Trillium Foundation grant will see a book by Agata Rajski entitled 100 lat Polonii w Windsor 1908-2008 (or, One Century of the Polish Community in Windsor, 1908-2008) published by Walkerville Publishing.

Polish Week in Windsor will also see a replica of a famous drinking fountain in Windsor's sister city, Lublin, Poland, installed on the riverfront. The fountain features a rearing goat—one of Poland's national symbols.

The exhibit at the Windsor Community Museum, 254 Pitt St. W., is currently on display and runs through the 100th anniversary week.






